### Rosary for Life on Mother's Day at St. Kevin's Parish

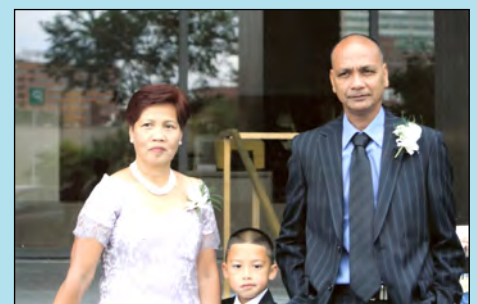
